In the following index, which covers Volume 36 - August, 2011 through July, 2012 of *Skinned Knuckles*, each subject is followed by a series of two numbers, separated by a hyphen. The first number, before the hyphen, represents the Issue Number (August is number 1, September number 2, through July number 12). The second number, after the hyphen, is the page number. In the case of a single entry, only one number will appear; in the case of multiple entries, a series of numbers, separated by a comma, will appear. Example: Carburetors, Ford Two-barrel.
